

Then, for anyone interested in the world of children's literature, Stephen will present an insightful talk on the process of creating children's picture books.




Lisa Wilkinson

She has lived her life in the public eye, but it all could have been so different ... Subjected to horrific bullying as a teenager, Lisa

survived by making herself as small as possible. But she swore when she left school that no one was ever again going to determine who she was - or limit what she



was capable of. She became the youngest ever editor of *Dolly* magazine before moving onto *Cleo* magazine, then hosting

The Today Show and The Project.

Warren Fahey's Bush Ballads, Folk Songs and City Dities


